Another Sign Rejected

Jesus gave the Jewish leaders many reasons to accept Him as the Messiah. He gave them many proofs that He was God's Son. From the very beginning all the signs pointed one way. All the Scriptures about the Messiah showed that Jesus of Nazareth was the One whom God had promised to send.

Lesson

The scribes and Pharisees knew those Scriptures better than anyone else. They knew how the prophets had described the Messiah. However, Jesus had not yet fulfilled all the prophecies about Himself. Those prophecies were the most important ones to the scribes and Pharisees, so they ignored the others.

The miracles Jesus did were signs that Jesus was the Son of God. Those Jewish leaders had to decide whether or not to believe those signs. And from the beginning they chose to reject them.

But Jesus, with His great love even for

the scribes and Pharisees, kept giving more and more signs. Bringing Lazarus back to life was His latest one. However, the Jewish leaders had three problems.

One: They were bitterly jealous of Jesus' power and popularity. So they said He got His power from Satan. They tried to make Him appear to be a great sinner.

Two: They thought they were righteous. When Jesus showed the sinfulness in their hearts, they became very angry. They would not admit He was God's Son who had the right to call them to repentance.

Three: Jesus wasn't doing the things they wanted their Messiah to do, so they refused to follow Him.

Even those who believed He was the Messiah had wrong ideas about what He planned to do. They expected Him to be an earthly ruler, and they were ready to see that He was crowned King. That made a problem for Jesus, because that was not what He had come to do. So when people He had healed realized He was the Son of God, Jesus commanded them, "Don't tell anyone." When the Jews came to force Him to be their king, He slipped away.

But now, Jesus was nearing the end of His life. Soon everyone would know the real reason why the Son of God had come to earth. And now He was willing for everyone to see Him as the Messiah, the Son of David, the King of the Jews. Now He would fulfill another prophecy about Himself. That would give the Jewish leaders one more sign, one last opportunity to accept Him.

The day after Mary had given Jesus her special gift, He and the disciples started for Jerusalem. When they came to the Mount of Olives, He stopped and said to two of the disciples, "Go into the village. There you will see a donkey's colt tied. Loose it and bring it here. If anyone wonders why you are doing that, tell him, 'The Lord needs it.' Then he will let you bring it."

The disciples went to the village close by. And sure enough, they saw a colt tied beside a door near where two paths came together. They began to untie it.

The owner was standing there and

asked, "What are you doing? Why are you untying my colt?"

"The Lord needs it," said the disciples. "Oh, that's all right, then," said the owner.

The disciples brought the colt to Jesus. They knew He planned to ride it the rest of the way to Jerusalem, so they put some of their robes on the donkey's back for Jesus to sit on.

As they moved toward the city, a huge crowd gathered and went with them. They began shouting and praising God for all the wonderful things Jesus had done. Some spread their garments in the road for the donkey to walk on. Others cut leafy palm branches from the trees along the way and scattered them in the way. Some of the people marched in front. Some followed behind. They cried, "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! **Hosanna** to the Son of David! Blessed be the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest Heaven!"

Did these people realize they were fulfilling **prophecy** written in their Scriptures? Had they ever read the words, "Rejoice greatly, daughter of Jerusalem. Shout, because your King comes to you. He is just and brings salvation. He is meek and
